Margaret Mills Harper is Glucksman Professor of Contemporary Writing in English at the University of Limerick, where she teaches and writes about modern and contemporary literature of Ireland and the United States. She is the author of *The Aristocracy of Art: Joyce and Wolfe* (1990); and *Wisdom of Two: The Spiritual and Literary Collaboration of George and W. B. Yeats* (2006). She has also co-edited two of four volumes of *Yeats's "Vision" Papers* (1992, 2001) and both 1925 and 1937 versions of *A Vision*, W. B. Yeats's book of occult philosophy. She is former Director of the Yeats International Summer School and former President of the International Yeats Society.

Maria Rita Drumond Viana is Professor C3 at the Department of Letters at the Universidade Federal de Ouro Preto, where she teaches at the undergraduate and postgraduate levels. She also supervises master's and doctorate theses at the Postgraduate Programmes in English and in Translation at the Universidade Federal de Santa Catarina, where she taught until 2021. She conducts research in Irish Studies and life writing as well as how Irish literature and life writing have been translated and edited in Brazil. She is the current vice-president of the International Yeats Society.

Seán Fleming is Minister of State at the Department of Foreign Affairs with responsibility for International Development and Diaspora. He was appointed to this role in December 2022. He previously served as Minister of State at the Department of Finance. Sean was elected to represent the Laois-Offaly constituency at the 2020 General Election, having been first elected to the Dáil in 1997. He was also elected as a member of Laois County Council in 1999 and served in the role for more than 4 years. An accountant educated at University College Dublin, Sean has served on the Dáil Public Accounts Committee. He was also a member of the Finance and Public Expenditure Committee and was Fianna Fáil spokesperson on Public Expenditure and Reform.
