The activities for the Symposium will take place at University of São Paulo on the 15th and 16th of October, at the AUCANI building.




VIA METRO (BUTANTÃ STATION)

The nearest **metro station** is <u>Butantã</u>, part of the Yellow Line. From there, it is possible to get a bus or an Uber to AUCANI.




Right next to Butantã Station, there is a Bus Terminal where it is possible to getone of the buses that goes to USP.

The bus line to AUCANI is **8084** and the bus stop is called **Bancos** (the fourth one, once inside the university). From there, it is a short walk to the AUCANI bulding.




To **leave AUCANI and USP**, get on the **8084** bus at the **Bancos** stop and disembark at the metro station.

WHERE TO EAT NEAR CENTRO MARIA ANTONIA


SOHO'S PLACE R. Maria Antônia, 140 - Vila Buarque

SABOR E ARTE R. Marquês de Itu, 693 - Vila Buarque



ROMA RISTORANTE R. Maranhão, 512 A - Higienópolis


